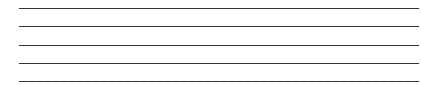

SUNDAY WARM-UP:

On Sunday mornings we have a warm-up at **10:15 A.M.** in the Parish Family Center. This warm-up time is essential to prepare ourselves – hearts and voices – for leading the sung prayer at the 11:00 Mass.

SUMMER SCHEDULE:

Summer is a time to relax and recharge our energies for the year to come. Consequently, the Chancel Choir does not usually have Wednesday rehearsals in the summer (unless we are asked to sing for a special event during the summer). Those who are “in town” meet on Sundays at **10:00 A.M.** in the Parish Family Center to rehearse music for the day. These extra few minutes help us make up for not rehearsing on Wednesdays in the summer.

Special musical presentations have included:

A sing-a-long *Messiah* with many local church choirs in Lubbock of all denominations and with members of the Lubbock Symphony Orchestra.

Amahl and the Night Visitors –

A one-act Christmas opera by Gian-Carlo Menotti, featuring the Chancel Choir as the Shepherds’ Chorus and various musicians and friends in the leading roles and the orchestra.

Homage to Mary – an evening of hymns, canticles, songs, and scripture readings with string quartet, flute, organ and choir to honor our Blessed Mother.

The Chancel Choir is a small ensemble of 25-30 voices – soprano, alto, tenor and bass. These highly dedicated, mostly untrained singers sing at the 11:00 a.m. Mass on Sundays. They also sing various special Masses throughout the liturgical year, such as the 11:00 p.m. Mass on Christmas Eve (accompanied by string quintet, handbells and organ), Good Friday, the Easter Vigil, as well as the Chrism Mass and sometimes at the Rite of Ordination to the Priesthood and to the Diaconate in the Diocese of Lubbock celebrations.

The Chancel Choir sings mostly traditional music with organ accompaniment or sometimes piano, brass, strings, handbells, or music for a cappella voices.
